This program includes a driving tour to significant sites as well as a visit to the Kentucky Center for African American Heritage (KAAHC). Catherine Fosl will lead this tour, who is Professor, Department of Women’s, Gender and Sexuality Studies and Director, Anne Braden Institute for Social Justice Research, University of Louisville. University of Kentucky professor Daniel Vivian will lead a behind-the-scenes tour of The Spirit of Kentucky, an exhibition celebrating the history and craft of bourbon whiskey, and the Kentucky Peerless distillery, one of Louisville’s several “urban distilleries.” Attendees will have the opportunity to sample Kentucky Peerless rye and bourbon whiskeys.
